

School Visits and Activities

During the coming year a number of visits and activities are planned. These will supplement the Year 3 curriculum. It is essential that permission slips are returned promptly to the teacher and that any money is paid in advance. All classes take part in at least one visit per year. Visits to local schools for sporting and community events are also organised. Some visits may require a voluntary parental contribution. Where possible these visits are subsidised in order to reduce the burden on parents. However if insufficient contributions are received we reserve the right to cancel the event.

Letters forms and monies

Absence notes, permission slips and money should be placed in the box by the office. These should come in a named envelope with the purpose and amount clearly marked. All absences must be accompanied by a note, even if we have already been notified in person or by telephone. Please send absence notes in on the first day back at school. An absence form is available from the office if you prefer.

Holiday tasks

The summer holiday should be a time of relaxation and fun – however some children find it extremely difficult to settle back into a school routine and this means their learning and that of their peers can be disrupted. We suggest that you still find time for regular reading and keep practising those all important number bonds and times tables! In addition your child may be asked to produce research ready for the new term.

Welcome to Year 3

**Information for pupils and
parents**

Welcome to Year 3.

This is an important year for our students; it heralds great changes for them. The children will become more independent learners, so they need to be punctual and appropriately prepared for each day. Parents are encouraged to let their children take responsibility for their own belongings e.g. ensuring that their homework and P.E. kits are in school on the correct day. This year pupils coming into Year 3 will be leading KS2 with the introduction of the new school uniform. All pupils in Year 3 will be expected to be wearing shirt and tie (clip on or straight) with a v-necked jumper or cardigan by the end of September.

Responsibilities

The children are responsible for keeping the classroom tidy; putting away learning resources and their own equipment. Year 3 also have additional responsibility for the school garden ensuring that it is rubbish free as well as weeding, planting, watering and tidying it as required.

How you can help

Equipment they need:

Please provide your child with the following NAMED items:

- A water bottle with sports cap
- A despatch bag for carrying books to and from school which must be brought in everyday (not a rucksack)
- A PE bag
- A flat pencil case that will fit in the pupil drawers (optional)

NAMED P.E. kit:

- School PE shirt and **black** shorts with **black** tracksuit bottoms for colder weather. (Girls may wear black leggings or tracksuit bottoms for modesty throughout the year.)
- Black plimsolls for indoor games
- Trainers for outdoor games
- Micropore tape to cover stud earrings if necessary.

At no time should any earrings other than simple studs be worn in school; hooped or dangly earrings are unsafe in the school environment.

For your own convenience, PE kit should be brought in at the beginning of term and taken home only at half term and the end of term.

Please ensure that all school uniform is also **named**.

Supporting your child's learning at home

Every day:

Please listen to your child read.

Help them prepare for the following day:

- reading book
- homework planner
- any letters

Check their bag for letters and their planners for any messages.

Get them to school by 8.50am.

Every week:

Ensure they have done their homework.

Help them to learn their spellings and to practise using these spellings in oral sentences.

Also encourage the children to practise their times tables so that they can chant their tables in order as well as being able to recall key facts out of order.

Encourage them to discuss their activities at school.

Spellings will be handed out on Mondays and need to be returned on Fridays.

Homework will be handed out on Thursdays and must be handed in on the following

Tuesday. Homework that is not returned on this day will not be able to be marked. If

your child is unable to complete their homework due to illness or other social commitments then please write a note in your child's planner explaining these key facts. If your child is unable to complete their homework at home then there is also homework club after school on a Thursday evening that they can attend free of charge.
