Wider World

- Fruits and vegetables come in lots of different colours. Can you think of a fruit or vegetable for every colour of the rainbow?
- Listen to three different genres of music and discuss the differences with an adult.

Maths

- Empty a packet of raisins. If there are more than 20 in the packet, ask a grown-up to help you count out 20. Each time you eat a raisin, count how many are left.
- In a shop, look at some birthday cards. What numbers can you see? Can you find the number 10? What about 11,12,13,14,15,16,17 etc.

PΕ

- Go through the kitchen cupboards/fridge.
 Which foods are healthy and unhealthy food items?
- Set up an obstacle course and see how many times you can complete it in a minute, can you improve your time?

Arts

- Draw a long snake and decorate it with different colours and shapes.
- Design and invent a new animal for the zoo. What will it look like? How many legs does it have? What does it eat? Draw a picture of your new animal and give it a name.

Literacy

- Cut out words/letters from a newspaper or magazine to create a message.
- Can you make up your own story and verbally retell it using some of the following words, 'Once upon a time, One day, First, then, next suddenly, unfortunately, luckily, Lastly. Think about characters and the setting too,

Citizenship

- Help an adult with the washing. What needs to be done to wash the clothes?
 How much soap goes in? How long will the wash take?
- How can you be a good friend? Come up with 3 things that make a good friend.

Topic

- Ask a grown up to help you find out a fact about your favourite zoo animal. You could use the internet or some non-fiction books to find some information.
- Have a look at some seed packets in the supermarket. What types of plants can you grow? What does a plant need for it to grow?

Me

- Talk for 1 minute about an activity you like to do and an activity you don't like to do and why.
- Talk/draw about the future. What would you like to happen when you're an adult? Start sentences with 'I will and I would'.

<u>Science</u>

- Go on a walk with a grown up around the garden or park. Look carefully to see what plants and flowers you can see growing.
 You could take some photos or draw pictures of the things you see.
- Carry out a scientific investigation! What
 is the fastest way to make an ice cube
 melt? Draw pictures of the different ways
 you tried to melt the ice and write down
 your findings.
