Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to a new term. Following our very mild Christmas weather the thermometer has definitely dropped this week. Whilst we encourage the children to burn off some energy at lunchtime, there is a KS2 classroom available for children to go into if they get too cold and if we think that the KS1 children are getting too cold outside we bring them back indoors for some 'wet play'.

However it is really important that your child comes to school with a coat and gloves, not to mention a jumper or cardigan and long socks, tights or trousers. Some of the girls are wearing ankle socks still, which really isn't suitable in this very cold weather.

Don't forget that the children are allowed to wear dark coloured tracksuits for outdoor PE so that they keep warm. School tracksuits are available to order from the office.

#### **Snow Problems**

The flurry of snow last weekend may have been the only snow that we see this season, but if it is not, you can find out whether the snow will prevent the school opening in the following ways:

- Internet: www.hertsdirect.org will contain information about the closure status
  of all schools in Hertfordshire. This can also be accessed from the front page
  of the Windermere website.
- Text: We will send a text to all parents for whom we have up to date mobile phone numbers. If you have recently changed your telephone number, then you should check that the office has your current mobile number listed.
- Radio: Three Counties Radio will include information about school closures during their broadcasts.

We never close the school without a good reason, but if there should be a snowfall during term time it may be necessary to close the school if we are unable to provide a safe environment for the children. This includes not having sufficient staff on site to provide an adequate level of supervision.

If the weather changes dramatically during the course of the school day, we are sometimes obliged to close early to ensure that everyone – children and staff – can get home safely. If this looks possible, then please look out for notification of an early closure on your mobile phones.
