**Attendance and Punctuality**

I'm really pleased to see that both attendance and punctuality are improving, however there are still a number of children who regularly arrive late. Good time-keeping is a valuable life-skill which future employers will value and children who arrive late in the mornings are immediately disadvantaged as they struggle to settle down.

Currently the whole school attendance is 96.4%, it would be great if we could get to at least 97% this year.

I know this is the season of sniffles, but encourage your child to come to school whenever possible, knowing that if we feel they aren't well enough to be at school we will contact you. The exception to this is sickness and diarrhoea - school health advice is that children (and adults) should stay at home for 48 hours following the last bout of illness, even if they seem fine.
