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Welcome Back to School!

What a delight to welcome everyone back to school and also to welcome some new faces to our ranks. It seems as though everyone had a good break and they have returned ready to greet the new school year with great enthusiasm.

On the first day of term we asked every pupil (except our brand new Reception pupils) to give us a word that summed up their feelings about being back at school. Although a few were nervous about the coming year, the overwhelming response was 'excited' or 'happy'. What more could we ask for?!

Unusually for us, we haven't had huge amounts of building work done during the summer holidays, but it has still been busy. The staffroom has had a much needed makeover with a new kitchen area and some proper desking to replace an old workbench. There has also been a lot of reorganising as we have moved the remaining books from the corridor down to the library and sorted out the first aid area and the meeting room.

Bookmarks and Barcodes

If you look inside the books that your child is bringing home from school you will find that each book contains a barcode. The barcode is unique to that specific copy and is stored on our library system - thanks to a small army of volunteers who have given up an extraordinary amount of time to catalogue all our books.



Your child also has a barcode, although this is on a bookmark and in their reading record book or planner. From now on, when your child borrows a book from school they scan the two barcodes and we know who has each book. This will allow us to keep track of our stock of books much more easily. It also means that once the final few books are added to the system, children will also be able to borrow a library book as well as their levelled reading book.

Every classroom has a scanner linked to the library system as well as the main library computer. If your child loses a book, we will be able to tell you which book it was to help your search.

If you remember, last year I mentioned that Miss Clark was leading our drive to improve our Science teaching and learning. To evidence the improvements across the school she was working towards one of the Primary Science Quality Marks. Having submitted all the data and evidence part way through the summer term, we had almost, but not quite, forgotten that we were waiting to hear if we had been successful.

So, it was a thrilling start to the new academic year to learn that not only had we been awarded the Primary Science Quality Mark, but at the silver standard and not just the bronze.

Well done to Miss Clark for leading the school's teaching and learning in this area.

Fresh Faces

The first day of the autumn term was the first day of big school for our thirty new faces in Reception. Amazingly there were very few tears from either pupils or parents



and all of the children seem to have settled well.

Over the past few years we have been honing our transition programme for our Reception pupils and their parents. Shortly after the allocation day we write a letter of welcome so that parents feel reassured and we invite them to a coffee morning so that they can begin to network with other parents and feel part of our lovely community.

The new pupils have two opportunities to come and stay for an afternoon; the first visit is in a small group joining some of the current pupils and the second visit is the new class as a whole for the first time. Parents are also invited to come into school, buy uniform, order milk and find out about school life in more detail.

Miss Rios has visited the local nurseries where the majority of our pupils will have come from and telephoned any others. In addition to this parents are given an opportunity to come in for a one to one meeting with Miss Rios and Mrs Alger so they can share information with staff that will make their child's start smoother.



This year we added two further steps. During the summer holidays every child will have received a little book about starting school at Windermere. It has illustrations that are specific to our school and aims to allay worries by explaining what to do when you arrive at school, if you are hungry or thirsty and what to do if you need to go to the toilet.

Then at the beginning of term parents were given a handbook, that hopefully explains everything you need to know about sending your child to Windermere.

With all this, we hope that our new pupils have settled well into their new school life.
